Kate Rowley is a deaf, psycholinguist based as a lecturer at University College London (UCL). Kate is also the current Deputy Director of the Deafness, Cognition, and Language Research Centre (DCAL). Her research focuses mainly on the language and literacy of deaf children and adults across all ages. Recently, she managed a large-scale research project looking at the relationship between BSL (British Sign Language) comprehension skills and English reading proficiency in deaf children between the ages of 4 and 18. She is currently a co-investigator on a longitudinal study that explores factors influencing literacy in deaf children between the ages of 8 and 11 years. Kate has also done much research into sociolinguistics, particularly language attitudes within the British, Deaf Community.
