

Key aim


• *methodologically advance* the field in comparative *qualitative, quantitative* and *mixed methods* studies on youth (adequate study designs, robust techniques)

• *promote mutual learning* and the *exchange of tools* for doing mixed methods analysis combining large-scale comparative quantitative and qualitative data

- Topic: inequalities among youths, i.e. comparative (dis)advantages of specific groups in various fields of life.

- 3 sessions with 9 papers

• MC Meeting in Valetta, Malta

- Joint meeting with WG 1
- Call for papers. 3 sessions with a total of 12 papers:
- 1. Individual and societal factors that create inequality and exclusion in the transition of youth from education to the labour market
- 2. Evidence and trends of the consequences of unemployment and precarious jobs on other life domains in youth.
- 3. Analysis of long-term socio-economic consequences, following a mixed-methods approach (3 papers, yet more people interested in joining). Set-up a sub-group working in this topic.

WG4 Evaluation of work so far an future plans

Evaluations of work so far

- Previous meetings have provided a good opportunity to connect researchers
- First collaborations between researchers successfully established
- Yet, more time required for/at meetings to follow up research and exchange further

Future plans

- Increased use of STSM grants to further establish contacts
- Joint meeting with WG1 in March 2020 to further elaborate the use of methodology in comparative research (invited speakers, extension of the network)
- Joint organisation of sessions at topical conferences (e.g. ESPANET 2020)
- Organizing seminars on comparative methods for studying Youth
- Preparation of further publications
- Organising a training school in comparative methods
